Loch Lomond Seaplane and Bute

Need to get out of the city? Well, how about flying out of Glasgow on a seaplane? From the heart of the city to meet Dualist off the tranquil Isle of Bute, this scenic flight up The Clyde and around the islands will amaze you.

Flying high.

Taking off from the River Clyde, this stunning tour will take in the best that the magnificent Scottish West Coast landscape has to offer. Flying at heights between 500 and 3,000 feet, the seaplane will take you down the Clyde Estuary past Loch Long and Dunoon towards the south west and the town of Rothesay on the Isle of Bute. With great visibility you can even see Northern Ireland!

We'll land in the seaplane off Port Bannatyne in Bute and transfer to Dualist for a magical journey up the chasm of the Kyles of Bute to Caladh Harbour. Whilst anchored at Caladh, behind the shelter of the small island of Eilean Dubh, a gourmet lunch provided by Fins of Fairlie will be served on board the boat.

Relax on a leisurely sail back to Port Bannatyne, before the return flight by seaplane back into Glasgow.

- 08:00** Meet at Glasgow Science Centre
- 09:00** Board Loch Lomond Seaplane
Scenic flight over Clyde and Islands
- 11:00** Arrive at Port Bannatyne Marina
Transfer to Dualist
- 12:00** Set sail to Caladh Harbour (near Tighnabruaich)
- 13:30** Arrival and lunch at Caladh Harbour
Provided by award-winning Fins of Fairlie
- 15:00** Leave Caladh Harbour
Return sail to Port Bannatyne Marina
- 16:30** Transfer to Loch Lomond Seaplane for return flight
- 17:30** Arrive back at Science Centre
